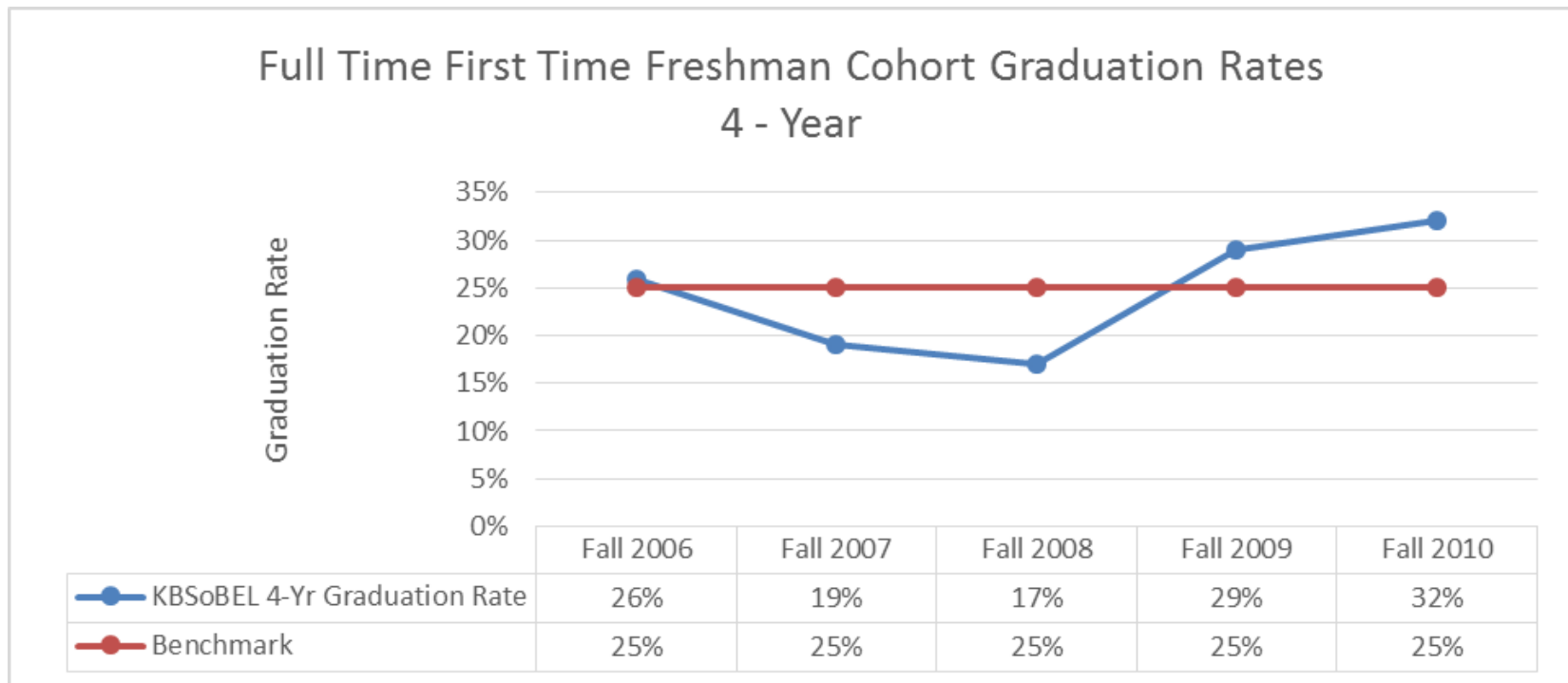

Current results are above benchmark	Recent data indicates an upward trend	A majority of undergraduate students in KBSOBEL play a sport. As a result, a proportion may choose to redshirt and stay an extra semester or year beyond the traditional four-years. Additionally, with the focus on improved retention it is believed that graduation rates will increase as a result. Continue to monitor and report.

Graduation rates are gathered annually for the cohort that started five years prior.	Currently above benchmark	Recent data indicates that 5-year graduation rates are trending upward	These results provide support that a proportion of KBSoBEL student athletes choose to redshirt and extend their degree completion an additional semester or year. Additionally, with the focus on improved retention it is believed that the 5-year graduation rate will increase as a result. Continue to monitor and report.
